

Book VII - VIII

- Juno serves as an agitator to Aeneas' plans (423-433)
- Motivated by pride to save her reputation + status among the gods (455-456)
- Juno continues to be petty by ignoring Aeneas' prayers and not supporting him even though other gods do (80)
- Lost to mother + son and not supported by other gods (last pg BK 8)

Juno - saving Turnus' life

Book X 801-64

wants to keep Turnus safe

Book X 874

makes a gift Aeneas to throw people off / protect Turnus

Book IX 1059

"Gave him heart + $\frac{1}{2}$ force" (Turnus)

books IV - VI

pg. 97 - Juno directed their ships
to Carthage

pg. 100 - Juno led Dido & Aeneas into
a cave & married them

pg. 146 - Juno sent Iris to get the
women to burn the ships

pg. 162 - Juno won't leave the
Trojans alone

Juno's Role:

Juno shall henceforth
mess up Aeneas & Co.

BOOKS I-III

Juno's role

Bk I

- line 5-8 buffeted by baleful Juno
- lines 14-19 Aeneas + Trojans have to face Juno's wrath
"can anger black as this prey on heaven"
- lines 24-32 Juno loves Carthage more than any other city
but knows the Trojans will destroy it
- lines 36-42 Juno is still angry at Trojans because of Paris who
"snubbed her loveliness"
- lines 91-105 Aeolus is asked to bring winds to throw Aeneas off course

Bk II

- line 804-809 Juno's wrath

Bk III

- lines 585-586 "make your prayer first to Juno's godhead"
